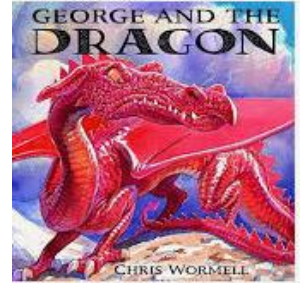

W.A.L.T: compare two characters

Use conjunctions to join two sentences

This week we are reading *George and the Dragon* by Chris Wormell.



Task 1

Think about the predictions that you made- were you right ? Discuss.

Task 2

Think about the two main characters - the dragon and *George Mouse*. Compare them. Think of things that are the same and things that are different.

Instead of writing two separate sentences - join your sentences with a conjunction.

If the things are the same you can use **and**.

If the things are different you can use **but**.

Remember each part must still make sense.

For example:

The dragon lives in a cave. The mouse lives in a cave. = two sentences

The dragon lives in a cave **and** the mouse lives in a cave too.

The dragon is big. The mouse is small. = two sentences.

The dragon is big **but** the mouse is small.
