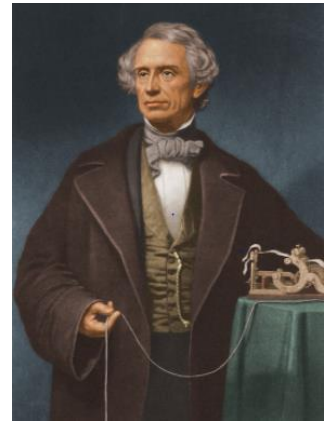


History – Tuesday 23rd February
