On 26<sup>th</sup> January 1926, John demonstrated the world's first true television.

During World War I (1914), he invented the glass razor which would not rust, and a special pair of warm socks for his cold feet!

John Logie Baird was born on 14<sup>th</sup> August 1888 in Scotland. At 13, he built a generator to make electric power to light the house.

John fell ill and died on 14<sup>th</sup> June 1946 at 58 years old.

By 1924, John managed to transmit a flickering image over a short distance.

During World War II (1939), John was asked to plan television for when the war ended.
