5. Click register.

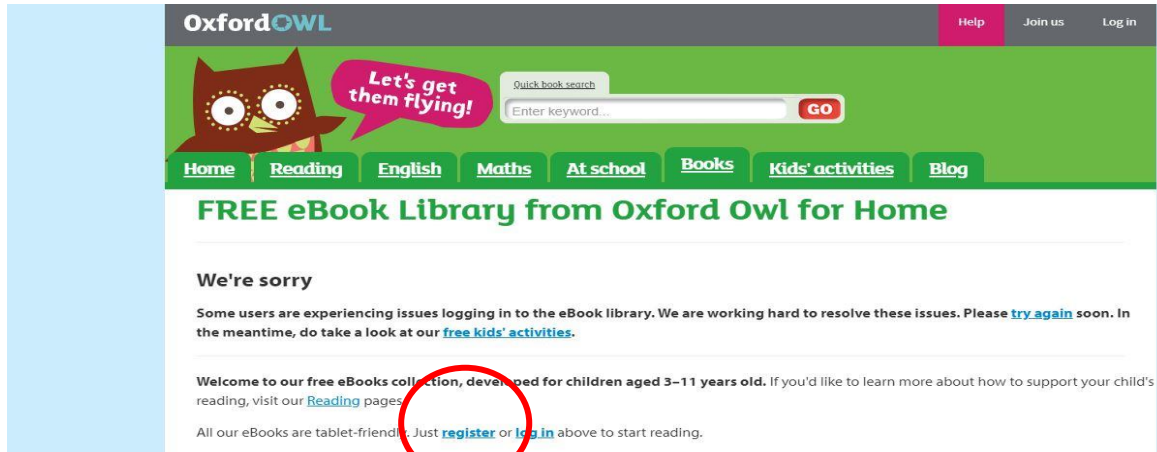


